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## SNOW INFORMATION

### **PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCIES**

If possible, all vehicles should find off street parking during Snow Emergency.

### **REGULATIONS FOR SNOW PLOWING - ALTERNATE SIDE OF THE STREET PARKING**

If your street runs EAST TO WEST: During and after it snows, no parking on the South Side of the street until the snow is plowed off the South Side. Then no parking on the North Side of the street until the snow is plowed off the North Side. If the street runs NORTH to SOUTH: During and after it snows, no parking on the East Side of the street until the snow is plowed off the East Side. Then no parking on the West Side of the street until the snow is plowed off the West Side.

### **SNOW REMOVAL**

**Snow removal:** sidewalks and parking lots. Snow and ice shall be removed from sidewalks and private parking lots within 24 hours after cessation of precipitation.

**Depositing of snow or ice into the streets is prohibited.** No person or other entity shall throw, place or deposit any snow or ice into or on any street in the Borough, and no owner, tenant or occupant shall cause or allow such throwing, placing or depositing or any snow or ice to remain in the street, being the intent and purpose of this provision to prohibit all such persons and entities from throwing, placing or depositing snow or ice which accumulated on the private property of adjoining sidewalks into the streets of the Borough.

**CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY**

No person shall occupy, rent, lease, sell, transfer title or permit the occupancy, letting or sale, or allow any person to live in or upon or inhabit as a tenant or occupant or to occupy as any new owner or co-tenant or co-owner any dwelling house or dwelling unit or any portion of a premises occupied for a separate and distinct commercial use within the confines of the Borough unless such person first obtains from the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough a certificate of occupancy and permit authorizing any of the foregoing and when any of the foregoing shall take place.

The certificate of occupancy for residential rental units shall be for a term of three years or until the change of ownership of the property or a change in the tenant of the property, whichever event is sooner.

## LEAVES, BRUSH & YARD WASTE

### **Pick up:**

All brush and yard waste shall be placed at curb side by 7:00am of the day designated for collection. No brush or yard waste shall be placed at the curb side more than 72 hours prior to any scheduled collection. The Public Works Department starts picking up on the designated Monday and can take a couple days to complete the town. If the Monday falls on a holiday pick-up will be the next working day.

**Brush** and shrubs in bundles not more than 8 inches in diameter and 10 feet in length may be placed between the curb and sidewalk for collection. Brush will be collected from March through November. Brush will be collected on the second and fourth Mondays in April and October. The second Mondays in March, May, June, July, August, September and November. There will be NO brush collection from December 1st - February 28th.

**Yard Waste** will be collected on the brush collection dates. Yard waste materials to be collected by the Borough of Bradley Beach shall be drained of all liquid and then placed at curb side in an authorized yard waste container ONLY. No yard waste loose at the curb will be collected and a summons will be issued for failure to comply.

**Leaves** may be placed, loose or bagged, at curb side from April 1 through May 31 and from September 15 through December 1. Leaves shall not be closer than 10 feet to drain inlet. Leaves may be placed for collection only in authorized biodegradable leaf bags.

**All leaves, brush & yard waste placed at any curb must have originated at the property adjacent to the curb at which same are placed for collection.**  
ALL ITEMS SHALL BE PLACED AT CURB IN SEPARATE PILES.

**GRASS CLIPPINGS WILL NOT** be collected by the Borough and SHALL NOT be placed at the curb at any time. In an event of a major storm Public Works will collect brush as needed. For special pick up contact Public Works. For further information please review Borough Ordinance Chapter 286 Article IV.

### Definitions:

**Authorized Yard Waste Container:** Trash or garbage container with approved label and drain holes to allow the water to drain. The container shall not exceed 50lbs with contents.

**Yard Waste:** Hedge/yard trimmings and vegetation from flowers and gardens. NO GRASS CLIPPINGS.

**Authorized Leaf Bag:** Biodegradable leaf bag

### **BBO SAFETY**

**NEVER** cook inside a garage, a covered porch or under a canopy covered patio.

**NEVER** use a grill on a balcony.

As part of annual maintenance check grill for sticky valves and rust. Replace worn parts.

Always store cylinders outside, in the upright position and **NEVER** inside.

After fill up or exchange bring propane tanks home, valve closed and capped in a ventilated vehicle.

**NEVER** store, use or transport near high temperature.

On refills/exchanges have supplier check cylinder for damage, rust, dents or leaks. Keep the grill at least five feet from a combustible wall or fence.

## RECYCLING PICK UP IS EVERY MONDAY THROUGHOUT THE BOROUGH.

Shampoo, detergent bottles **(no caps)**  
Chipboard  
Plastic Tubs and Lids  
Shredded Paper

***Loose and mixed in one can. Nothing tied (newspaper/cardboard). Not in plastic trash bags. These items below go in your regular "kitchen trash."***


### **Not Acceptable Items:**

Plastic or metal hangers or bottle/jar caps  
Shopping bags of any kind  
Wax-covered cardboard , waxed paper, drink boxes  
Paper plates, paper cups, paper towels or tissues, paper milk/juice containers, Pizza boxes  
Plastic utensils, plastic straws  
Deli/take out food containers, Styrofoam, popcorn packaging, plant trays  
Frozen food, ice cream or frozen juice containers  
Window glass, light bulbs, drinking cups, mirrors, ceramics, dishes, cookware  
Wire, Christmas lights, scrap metal  
Diapers, photographs, garden hose, VCR tapes, stickers or sheets of address labels, Tyvek Envelopes

#### COMPUTER, ELECTRONIC AND HAZARDOUS WASTE INFORMATION

##### COMPUTER/ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DROP-OFF

*State Law now prohibits disposal of computers and TVs with trash. Free drop off program open to all Monmouth County residents, small businesses and institutions. Limited to one pickup truckload.*

**Items Accepted: Computer Cases, CPU's, Monitors, Scanners, Laptops, Peripherals, Radios, Cameras, Copiers, Fax Machines, Stereo Components, Keyboards, Mice Printers, Cables, Televisions, Telephones, VCR's and DVD Players.**

**Car Batteries & Motor Oil -Rechargeable & Button Batteries** - Car batteries can be brought to a scrap yard. Motor Oil can be brought to HHW facility, many municipal recycling depots, or local service stations. Most common household batteries (A, AA, AAA, C, D, 9 Volt) can be disposed in regular trash. However, rechargeable batteries should be brought to retail store drop offs (check www.rbrc for locations), and silver "button batteries" should be returned to municipal or county sponsored drop offs. Contact your municipality for locations of containers for button batteries.

##### Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Facility- 3211 Shafto Road, Tinton Falls, NJ 07753

The operations of the Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Facility is contracted out to Radiac Environmental Services. The hours of operation for household hazardous waste drop-off at the facility will be as follows: Tues & Wed from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.- Thurs & Fri from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. - Sat from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

##### Important Information:

**The Facility is open to Monmouth County residents only.**

**There will be NO appointment required to drop off materials at the facility.**

**The facility limits residents to 20 gallons of liquid or 220 pounds of dry material per visit.**

**Liquid containers limited to 5 gallon size maximum.**

**Solid packages limited to 50lb. weight maximum.**

**NO business or commercially generated waste materials accepted.**

**Asbestos, ammunition, fireworks, gunpowder, boat flares, radioactive materials (smoke detectors), medical waste, and medical sharps are not permitted for disposal at the facility. Monmouth County reserves the right to reject participants and/or materials at its sole discretion. For further information, call 732-683-8686 and follow the prompts for "household hazardous waste disposal."**

##### BULK ITEMS

Bulk stickers are required for items that are **not considered regular household garbage or building material**. These stickers can be obtained at Borough Hall. Bulk trash shall only be placed at the curb 12 hours before regulated pickup days. **ANYONE WITH RECYCLING ITEMS IN THEIR TRASH WILL BE SUBJECT TO A SUMMONS**

**286-34 BULK STICKER FEES FOR COLLECTION OF BULK GOODS** The following schedule of the number of fee stickers required for each bulk item is based on four fee stickers for 25 pounds of weight. The weight of items used in this schedule are estimated weights formulated by the Department of Public Works. If any item not on this schedule is being placed for collection, the person placing the item should estimate the total weight to the item (in pounds) and divide the figure by 25 to arrive at the number of fee stickers required for that item. Any person unable to estimate the weight of any item may call the Department of Public Works for an estimate. ***Below is a list of the most common items put at curbside for disposal. NOTE: Items weighing less than 25 pounds require four stickers, provided that items weighing more than 25 pounds may be combined and placed together in a bag as long as the bag does not weigh more than 25 pounds. Four stickers must then be placed on the outside of the bag.***

Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home.


Everyone will meet at the meeting place.

Practice your home fire escape drill twice a year!



## **SMOKE and CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR SAFETY**

### **WHAT TYPE DO I NEED?**

There are three types of smoke detectors PHOTO ELECTRIC, IONIZATION and DUAL SENSOR. Each alarm will respond differently depending on the nature of the fire. The Consumer Product Safety Commission and the US Fire Administration recommend the DUAL SENSOR for optimal response.

- There should be a minimum of one smoke detector on each floor outside the bedrooms
- Carbon Monoxide detector shall be installed within 10 feet of each bedroom
- The most important thing after you purchase and install your smoke alarms is to maintain them.
- A non-working alarm is about as effective as not having an alarm.
- Change your batteries at the annual time changes or whenever it “chirps” a low battery signal.
- Press the test button every so often to make sure it is working.



### **Carbon Monoxide FACTS:**

Carbon Monoxide is a toxic gas which can kill you even before you are aware it is in your home or apartment. At low levels it can mimic flu symptoms, including nausea and fatigue, headaches and dizziness, The effects are different based upon your general health, age and level of exposure.

Carbon Monoxide has many sources: gas fired appliances, wood burning stoves, fireplaces and your garaged motor vehicle. People do die, and hundreds are injured every year, due to carbon monoxide poisoning. Please be careful.

## **FLOOD INFORMATION AND SAFETY TIPS**

### **WHAT IS A FLOOD?**

Anywhere it rains, it can flood. A flood is a general and temporary condition where two or more acres of normally dry land or two or more properties are inundated by water or mud flow. Many conditions can result in a flood: hurricanes, overtopped levees, outdated or clogged drainage systems and rapid accumulation of rainfall. Just because you haven't experienced a flood in the past, doesn't mean you won't in the future. Flood risk is not just based on history, it's also based on a number of factors: rainfall, river-flow, tidal-surge data, topography, flood-control measures, and changes due to building and development.

Flood-hazard maps have been created by the federal government to show different degrees of risk for your community, which help determine the cost of flood insurance. The lower the degree of risk, the lower the flood insurance premium. Homeowners Insurance does not provide coverage for floods. A separate policy must be obtained. The federal government offers such policies. See below.

### **HOW CAN I TELL IF MY HOME IS IN THE FLOOD ZONE?**

The Borough of Bradley Beach is mainly not in the flood zone. Small sections of land near Sylvan Lake and Fletcher Lake are in the flood zone. To determine your zone, you can contact Borough Hall, or go to the Borough website [www.bradleybeachnj.gov](http://www.bradleybeachnj.gov) and click the link to FEMA or onto the website: [www.fema.gov](http://www.fema.gov) and click on maps, then flood map online and enter address.

### **IF FLOOD INSURANCE IS NEEDED, PLEASE SEE THE BELOW INFORMATION:**

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which works closely with nearly 90 private insurance companies to offer flood insurance to property owners and renters. In order to qualify for flood insurance, a community must join the NFIP and agree to enforce sound floodplain management standards. The Borough of Bradley Beach is a NFIP member. The NFIP, a federal program, offers flood insurance, which can be purchased through property and casualty insurance agents. Rates are set and do not differ from company to company or agent to agent. These rates depend on many factors, which include the date and type of construction of your home, along with your buildings level of risk.

**DRIVING FLOOD FACTS:** The following are important points to remember when driving in flood conditions:

- Six inches of water will reach the bottom of most passenger cars causing loss of control and possible stalling.
- A foot of water will float many vehicles.
- Two feet of rushing water can carry away most vehicles including sport utility vehicles (SUV's) and pick-ups.

**AFTER A FLOOD:** The following are guidelines for the period following a flood:

- Listen for news reports to learn whether the community's water supply is safe to drink.
- Avoid floodwaters; water may be contaminated by oil, gasoline, or raw sewage. Water may also be electrically charged from underground or downed lines.
- Be aware of areas where floodwaters have receded. Roads may have weakened and could collapse under the weight of a car.
- Stay away from downed power lines, and report them to the power company.
- Return home only when authorities indicate it is safe.
- Use extreme caution when entering buildings; there may be hidden damage, particularly in foundations.
- Service damaged septic tanks, cesspools, pits, and leaching systems as soon as possible. Damaged sewage systems are serious health hazards.
- Clean and disinfect everything that got wet. Mud left from floodwater can contain sewage and chemicals.

## **EMERGENCY SITUATIONS:**

*EXAMPLES: FLOODS, HURRICANES, BLIZZARDS, ETC.*

Listen to the radio stations WJLK (94.3), WOBM (92.7) and WRAT (95.9) or television for information.

Residents will also be alerted with the Shore Area Emergency Notification System. Residents may sign up at [www.bradleybeachnj.gov](http://www.bradleybeachnj.gov) and click on the link for the [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov).

Be aware that flash flooding can occur. If there is any possibility of a flash flood, move immediately to higher ground. Do not wait for instructions to move. Be aware of streams, drainage channels, canyons and other areas known to flood suddenly. Flash floods can occur in these areas with or without such typical warnings as rain clouds or heavy rain.

If you must prepare to evacuate, you should do the following:

Secure your home. If you have time, bring in any moveable items. Move essential items to an upper floor. Turn off utilities including gas and propane at the main switches or valves if instructed to do so. And have all tools ready in the event that they need to be shut off. Disconnect electrical appliances. Do not touch electrical equipment if you are wet or standing in water

If you have to leave your home, remember these evacuation tips:

Do not walk through moving water. Six inches of moving water can make you fall. If you have to walk in water, walk where the water is not moving. Use a stick to check the firmness of the ground in front of you. Do not drive in flooded areas. If floodwaters rise around your car, abandon the car and move to higher ground if you can do so safely. You and the vehicle can be quickly swept away.

Prepare an Emergency Supply Kit which should include items such as water, non-perishable food, battery powered radio, flashlight and extra batteries, any medication immediately needed and sanitary items for your family. You may want to prepare a portable kit to keep in your car in case you are told to evacuate. sanitary items for your family. You may want to prepare a portable kit to keep in your car

Make a Family Emergency Plan. It is important to know how you will contact family members in case of emergency or evacuations and how you will get back together.

Be informed. The Bradley Beach Office of Emergency Management will continue to update you on the progress of a severe weather event by means of Reverse 911 system or visit the [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov) to obtain further information on emergency Supply Kits and Making Family Emergency Plans.

## **FLOOD SAFETY TIPS BEFORE A FLOOD**

To avoid flood damage, you should:

Avoid building in a floodprone area unless you elevate and reinforce your home.

Elevate the furnace, water heater, and electric panel if susceptible to flooding.

Install “check valves” in sewer traps to prevent floodwater from backing up into the drains of your home.

Contact community officials to find out if they are planning to construct barriers to stop floodwater from entering the homes in your area.

Seal the walls in your basement with waterproofing compounds to avoid seepage.
