Sustainability and Coastal Stewardship (Environmental Commission)

Action Area:

Meredith DeMarco and Environmental Commission proposed the following strategic recommendations for 2021 – Environmental Resource, Birds and Animal Inventory, Lake Stability and Standards, Community Gardens, and Shade Tree Commission (% of Shade Tree Coverage) collaboration. Beach Science project to be discussed. Report from 10 Years ago to be reviewed.

(1) Beachfront and Oceanfront Development (Beachfront and Oceanfront Task Force)

Action Areas:

The Task Force reconvened and recommends these Beachfront and Oceanfront Capital improvements for the 2021 Beach Capital Budget, and urges allocation to these priorities as a positive resident action. Priorities- Restaurant, Showers, Water Bottle Stations, Extended Mats/ Accessibility, Bike Racks, Playground Upgrades, Street Crossings. Estimated Cost \$350,000.

Post Meeting, the following items have been added by Al Gubitosi for consideration and prioritization by the Task Force - Horseshoe Board Replacement, Additional Ramps for Seniors, Disabled and Children, New Lifeguard Benches. Estimated Cost \$250,000. Also, consideration suggested for purchasing light poles from JCPL and relocating benches.

Followup report and discussion of Beautification recommendations and Water Flow will occur at December meeting. Beach Science project is recommended as an Environmental Commission project and will be discussed.
