- 2.) Approval of February meeting minutes
  - a. Motion Geoff

- 3.) Presentation by Charlie Kratovil of Food and Water Watch re: 100% renewable energy aggregation ordinance
  - a. Communicy choice aggregation
    - i. Service stays the same
      - 1. Same utility bill
      - 2. Same transmission lines
      - 3. Same meters
    - ii. Source of electricity changes
      - 1. Third party electricity generation
        - a. Supplier is chosen by the towns
      - 2. More renewable energy
      - 3. More stable prices
      - 4. Savings through bulk purchase
  - b. Benefits
    - i. Savings for residents through bulk purchasing and competitive bidding
    - ii. Accelerates transition to 100% clean, renewable sources of electricity
    - iii. Provides more stability in energy prices
  - c. Clean energy transition
    - i. Minimum renewable standards by state is 21%
      - 1. This would bring us up to 30%
      - 2. 40% in 2022-23
      - 3. 50% in 2024-25
  - d. Can share with us the model ordinance already adopted by Red Bank
  - e. Our questions
    - i. We're following Red Bank's lead and will wait for their offer to decide if it's right for us
      - 1. Apprehensive to commit to 100% until we hear back from Red Bank
        - a. Council has the final say
    - ii. How would residents buy-in
      - Residents would be automatically enrolled and have the chance to opt-out
        - a. Except for those already with renewables in their portfolio
    - iii. Reliability?
      - 1. Would still be on the same grid

- iv. We would be interested in seeing the ordinance and what other towns are already doing this
- f. BBEC is in support of this
  - We've already committed to this (i.e., interested), but we have the option to back out if Red Bank (i.e., the energy consultant) comes back with something we don't like

      - 1. We should back off and give them the latitude to get established and be independent (Rona)
      - 2. Our recommendation to the Strategic Planning Committee would be that the Shade Tree Commission would take on this study

    - i. Liz will update us at April BBEC meeting
