MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS

Mayor Engelstad stated the following:

- The DPW is down two members and to respect their workload.
- The goal at this time is to maintain trash pick-up and recycling.
- Is grateful for the community spirit & asked everyone to look out for their neighbors.
